Human H5N1 Infection: 256 sick, 151 dead





## Factors Associated with Human Disease

- Home preparation of sick poultry
- Defeathering
- Contact with soil contaminated with feces of infected birds
- Cohabitation with sick birds
- Potentially water contamination
- Close contact with very ill family member





# Factors NOT Associated with Human Disease

- Eating prepared poultry
- Depopulating poultry
- Unprotected health care workers (a couple of exceptions)
- Poultry farming

## Factors Contributing to Spread

- Animal Movement
- Persistence
  - 56°C for 3 hours
  - 60°C for 30 min
  - Water for 4-30 days
  - Manure for 105 days
- HPAI infectivity
  - 1 gm manure can infect1 million birds





## Factors Contributing to Spread



"Mechanical transmission by anything that can walk, crawl, or fly from farm to farm can and will occur. Rodents, insects (including flies) and wild birds (like sparrows) can act as vectors for AIV by carrying the virus on their bodies from place to place."



### Risk to Georgia



- Largest poultry industry in US
- "Old world" Asian migratory birds do not interact with "new world" birds



## Risk to Georgia



- Migratory birds?
- ◆ Importation
  - Exotic birds
  - Illegal smuggling
  - Human travel



### Georgia Preparedness

- ♦ GA Department of Agriculture
  - Active and passive surveillance in commercial industry
  - Surveillance at other poultry venues
- ♦ USDA Wildlife Services
  - Wild bird surveillance
- ◆ USDA APHIS
  - Closed to imports from affected countries
  - All imported birds tested

  - Tabletop
    - Local:State response tested
    - State:Federal response tested
  - Field
    - Depopulation and disposal of commercial flocks
    - Vector control
